

Webinars and Continuing Medical Education: Pros, Cons, and Controversies

One of the most important effects of the crisis caused by coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) at a global level was on education and its delivery, mainly of the face-to-face type.^{1,2} The pandemic posed challenges and necessitated changes to the previously used system and created opportunities for growth and innovation.
